They became affectionately known as the 'Stump Gang' and we were privileged to capture their adorable antics!



They've now left the stump to find their own territory, but the threat of introduced predators like cats and foxes and habitat fragmentation, is pushing them and their species towards extinction.

With dwindling numbers, these numbats, which are the Western Australian mammal emblem, are a vital part of the total numbat population.

With fewer numbats remaining than Orangutans in Sumatra or Giant Pandas in Asia, time is critical to ensure future generations get to see numbats in the wild.

At Project Numbat we strive to raise community awareness and involvement in the conservation of our unique State mammal emblem and also raise funds that directly benefit on-the-ground numbat conservation.
